# PEACE LEAGUE

New York, June 2-A committee of

proposals for a league of peace or league of nations.

It is proposed, according to the text of the call, that the United States shall become one of the league of nawets which shall agree to use their joint inflittary forces to prevent any one of their number from going to war with another before recourse is half to a judicial tribunal, or, where the question in dispute is not justiciable, to an international council of conciliation.

The plan is largely the idea of Mr. Taft, who will preside at the conference and is understood to have the personal though unofficial, indorsement of President Wilson.

The proposal for an international council of conciliation for questions that are known as non-justiciable, that is, those questions which are not considered triable in a judicial tribunal, has not been discussed hitherto.

University and college presidents, the governors of two states, educators, financiers, diplomats, lawyers and business men are among the signers, who are described as a national provisional committee for a league of peace.


