Canadian Press. MONTREAL, Oct. 22.—Smelters on the opening of the stock market this morning jumped two points in the first few minutes of trading to 158. Montreal Power opened half a point down, sagged another half to 214½. Steamships preferred, up ½ at the opening, 64½, dropped to 64 for a net decrease of ½, and Brazilian opened ½ up at 78½, but sagged a quarter.

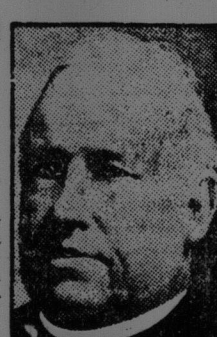

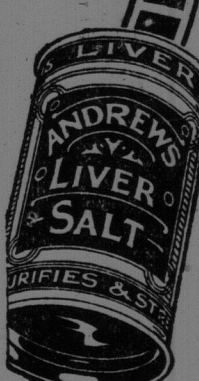
