a hill above the Soligo, a tributary of the new piece has the design of the old armor restored upon it skillfully by Museum workmen, and is also signed and dated by them. It will go down to future generations not as a forgery but as a twentieth century restoration.

Eighteen recently acquired engraved gems have been added to the Museum's already fine collection and are being exhibited temporarily together in the small case in the Fifth Classical Room before they are distributed in their respective galleries. They are Minoan Greek and Roman and were probably used for seals. A Minoan, the earliest about 1400 B. C., with a reclining bull and a flower upon it, was worn by the owner on a string around the wrist for convenience. There are also two gems engraved in the round, one a carnelian back to back, and another of chalcedony, the head of a youth with thick curly hair, both Roman of the imperial period.

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE offers to holders of these bonds who desire to continue their investment in Dominion of Canada securities the privilege of exchanging the maturing bonds for new bonds bearing 5 1/2 per cent interest payable half yearly, of either of the following classes:—

(a) Five year bonds, dated 1st November, 1922, to mature 1st November, 1927.

(b) Ten year bonds, dated 1st November, 1922, to mature 1st November, 1932.
