Daily Hints For the Cook

QUAKER MUFFINS. One cup of scalded milk poured on two-thirds cup of rolled oats. Let stand five minutes, add three tablespoons of sugar, 1/2 teaspoon of salt, two teaspoons of oil, lard or melted butter. Sift in 1 1/2 cups of flour, 4 teaspoons of baking powder. Mix thoroughly, add 1 well-beaten egg. Bake in hot greased gem (iron) pans 20 to 25 minutes.

AMBER RICE PUDDING. Boil 1 pound of rice until tender in plenty of salted boiling water. Drain and press into a well-greased border-mold. Let it stand until perfectly cold. Drain a quart jar of preserved peaches from their liquor, remove the stones and press the peaches through a coarse sieve. Add 1 teaspoon of lemon juice and 1 cup of cream whipped to a stiff froth. Turn out the rice on a flat dish and pour over it a syrup made from 1-4 pound of sugar and 1/2 cup water, flavored with lemon juice. Put the peach mixture in the center of the rice border.

Now, if you will open the windows before beginning your sweeping operations, you will see most of the dust float out into the open air, and what remains can do your hair no harm. Let me tell you how to hold the broom. Sweep with your back held erect, chest thrown out and abdomen drawn in. The top of the broom should be grasped by the other hand. A REPLY TO HIS LORDSHIP BISHOP RICHARDSON'S SERMON ON CHRISTIAN SCIENCE.

To the Editor of the Times:— Sir: According to history for nearly two centuries after Jesus' ascension the early Christians followed the whole command of the Saviour—even raised the dead. It might be argued that the command, "And as ye go preaching, saying, the Kingdom of God is at hand, heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead," was to the twelve apostles only, but when Jesus said, "These signs shall follow them that believe in My name, whosoever shall cast out devils, they shall speak with new tongues, they shall take up serpents, and shall drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them," etc., Jesus plainly stated how to know a believer. Mrs. Eddy's teachings are wholly constructive. On page 444 of Science and Health read: "Students are advised by the author to be charitable and kind, not only to differing forms of religion and medicine but to those who hold these differing opinions. Let us be faithful in joining the way through Christ, as we understand it, but let us also be careful always to judge right judgment and never to condemn rashly." A merchant fixes the price on his goods. The Editor fixes the price of her books. The cheapest binding of Science and Health being \$3.25 in New Brunswick, it is quoted as \$2.50 as quoted so feelingly by the bishop as being too high a price for the poor. The poor can get Science and Health free at the public libraries. Also at the Christian Science Reading Rooms, 12 Germain street, are free loaned. The Christian Science periodicals, including the Christian Science Monitor, a daily newspaper eliminating crime, and the Christian Science Herald, had been loaned to the Y. M. C. A. and public libraries, so it is erroneous to call Christian Science merchandises. The title Officer d'Academie was conferred upon Mrs. Eddy by the French government in 1892. The International Book and Paper Exposition, a grand prize for her work, and a diploma of honor, as founder of Christian Science.

Christian Scientists are likewise striving to do this. The old is spoken of as a dream in the Bible and the awakening in His likeness is the putting on the new man. In doing this no Christian believes he has no body, neither do Christian Scientists. When the one begins to put on the new man, begins to do to others as he would like to be done by; then he is governed by God. "He is a man of principle."
