SENATOR ELLIS... case. That which a few years ago was regarded as impossible is now commonplace. If there is to be a satisfactory development of East St. John the extension of the street car line to Little River must come as a matter of course; but the sooner that extension is made the more rapid will be the development.

DISAPPOINTMENT... The hope is expressed in England that the King and Queen may open the Irish Parliament in person, and that the event may transpire in the year 1915, with His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught filling the office of Lord Lieutenant. If this programme should be carried out, Sir Edward Carson and other breeders of strife will find their occupation gone.

HOSPITAL NEEDED... The municipal council will no doubt take action at its meeting next week which will hasten the work of providing a hospital for advanced cases of tuberculosis. The need for this hospital is very urgent. The Society for the Prevention of Tuberculosis is in a position to give very forcible illustrations of the need. One very serious case has been brought to their attention during the last few days. If the disease is to be stopped with successfully, provision must be made for the care of advanced cases of tuberculosis which is at present a source of infection and of danger to the health of the community. Splendid work has already been done in dealing with some incipient cases at the River Glade Sanitarium, but so long as advanced cases are left without proper care the disease will continue to spread. Any unnecessary delay in providing a hospital for such cases in this city will be little short of a crime against the public health.

THE NAVAL ISSUE... The Toronto World comments to every Canadian an article from the Winnipeg Free Press dealing with the naval question in Canada. The World is a Conservative paper, and the Winnipeg Free Press is Liberal. The article in the Free Press severely criticizes the Borden policy, but the most interesting portion is not merely one between the ins and outs, but one which involves the whole future of Canada and the status of every man in Canada. We quote: "Every Canadian who gives thought to the question of the future of our country must come to some decision as to where he stands. He must choose between Canada as a nation with its own fully developed national life, its own literature, its own art, its own atmosphere and its own soul; and a provincialized Canada adjusting its life to standards idealized, conforming itself more and more to imported conventionalities; representing, as treacherous, all native aspirations and yearnings. When the issue becomes quite clear those who hold that this is their land will have to band themselves together, leaving prudential, business and social considerations aside, for desperate, unyielding resistance to the powerful conspiracy which aims to rob them of their country."

REAL ESTATE NEWS... The Maritime Properties Limited yesterday secured possession of the land at the Golden Ball corner at the intersection of Union, Sydney and Waterloo streets. The cost was said to be in the vicinity of \$25,000. Mrs. W. P. Keenan owns the wooden tenement on the site. The site is a most historic one and many merry gatherings have been held there in by-gone years. Some years ago a man named Hopley kept a tavern there, and later the building which succeeded the inn, was widely known as an amusement centre where some of the first theatrical enterprises coming to the city were shown.
