EVIDENCE FINISHED

Hearings Conclude With Cross-examination of Besco President and Summing up

HALIFAX, Dec. 23—The Royal Commission investigating the coal industry of Nova Scotia under the chairmanship of Sir Andrew Rae Duncan, concluded its evidence taking sessions tonight when President R. W. Molin, of the British Empire Steel Corporation was questioned by the chairman and Major Hume Cronyn, and John W. McLeod, district president of the United Mine Workers of America, closed the case for the men.

The conclusion charged by the government of Nova Scotia with the task of inquiring fully into all matters relating to the coal industry, has been engaged in the work for upwards of two months, holding public sessions in Sydney and Halifax and visiting Montreal and Cumberland and Pictou counties in Nova Scotia. Next week will be spent in drawing up the findings which the chairman announced tonight would be submitted to the government at the earliest possible moment.

The Brazilian Legislature, according to word received here, has been asked to authorize the loan, which would be used to bolster the coffee market against any material price declines.

SAYS PRICES UNFAIR.

Mr. Hoover himself has launched an attack on the rubber prices, in which he will enlist the co-operation of the country's automobile users and there is no doubt that he will reiterate his appeal to decrease consumption of coffee.

Only recently the secretary declared that prices charged United States householders for many foreign commodities were unfair and that steps must be taken to "defend our selves against trade war being made upon us."

He suggested that consumers organize in a strong sympathetic campaign to restrict their use of the products monopolized by cartels, and that buyers be permitted through legislation, to combine for the emergency against foreign monopolies.
