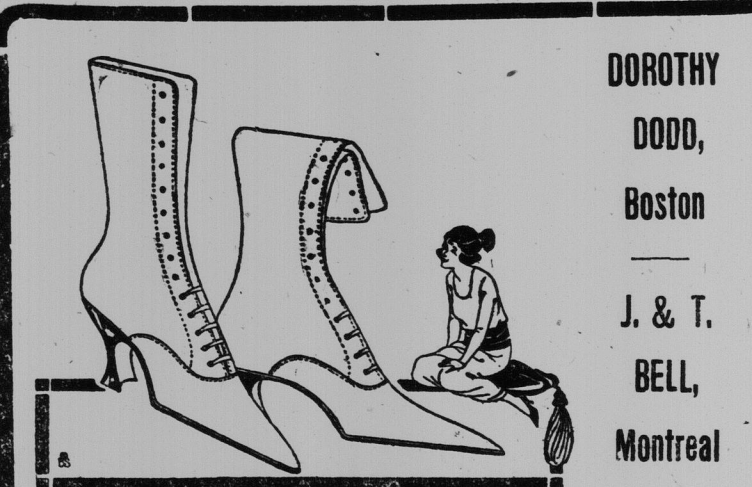

GIVES SLOW POISON
TO HER CHILDREN

Detroit Mother Had Quarrelled With Husband About Going on Stage

Detroit, Oct. 10.—Mrs. Hazel Leukart, 27, of Royal Oak, has confessed that she poisoned her two golden-haired little girls, aged eight and six, on the night of Sept. 26, and sat at their bedside until morning "hoping and praying they would die."

The act, she said, followed a quarrel with her husband, who refused to permit her to go upon the stage. The confession was made to George A. Setton, Oakland County Jail in Pontiac.

The children were given a slow, insidious poison that paralyzes its victims and steals with slow march upon the head, which it finally stills. Those doomed so to die feel no pain but a great lassitude. They retain consciousness to the end.

In her confession she said: "I have had the poison in the house for years and knew it would cause a slow, lingering death from which there was no recovery. Mr. Leukart and I had quarrelled over the stage. I wanted to be an actress, he would not permit me to leave the children."

"I love my little girls dearly. It was my great love that prompted me to believe them better off dead. I know I must pay the penalty for this deed, that perhaps may be imprisonment for life but I am reconciled to my fate."

School Journeys.

School journeys are in future to form an important part of the educational work of the English schools. Under the provisions of the new educational act the London county council intends to arrange this summer about 4000 children to participate. The journeys are planned to extend over a fortnight. Traveling expenses are to be paid jointly by the board of education, the London county council and the parents.

Is it not possible, asks a Toronto Globe writer, for the nine provincial governments in Canada to do the same kind of thing? It has been suggested that the governments arrange with the Canadian railways for parties of Canadian teachers to tour Canada during the summer vacation. It would be a wise investment of public funds and a step in the broader Canadianization of our people.
