Trinity possesses, in its buildings and grounds, a valuable unencumbered property, forming an equipment sufficient for the carrying on of its work for many years.

2. The University was never more efficient. During the last few years its work has extended in many directions, and the number of its students in Arts and Divinity has been steadily increasing.

3. Trinity is every year increasing its hold on the Province, and the two special features in its system—Residence in the College Building and the union of Religious with Secular Education—are becoming daily more valued.

4. Trinity is the chief Training School in the Province for the education of the Clergy, and is the University of the whole Church of England, under the control of all the Bishops of the Province.
