

Birch.-Logs have been imported dur-ing the past month to the extent of 59,000 cubic feet; there has been a fair consumption, and the stock is now in-oreased to 65,000 cubic feet; values are slightly easier. Planks have arrived on a large scale, but have been in fair demand, and the stock of 124,000 cubic feet is not excessive, but prices still continue on a low basis.
