TERM IN THE **STATE PRISON**

BOSTON, Mass, June 10.—After pleading guilty to manslaughter, Herman M. Perry, was sentenced to not less than five nor more than ten years in state prison by Judge Sanderson in the Superior Court today for having shot and killed Miss Catherine McDougall, of Yarmouth, N. S., in a house in the South End on February 24th last. Perry, who is said to have formerly lived in Burlington, Vt., was indicted for murder in the first degree, but the state accepted his plea of manslaughter. Chief Dugan of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation stating to the court that he believed that Perry was temporarily crazed by Jespondency over business troubles.
