Ald. Potts, Chairman Of Ferry Committee Contends Mr. Holt's Figures Are Misleading—Many Items To Be Considered By Tax-Payers Before Approving Scheme—Better Ferry Service Remedy For Present Difficulties.

Ald. Potts, chairman of the ferry committee, speaking yesterday of the letters of Mr. F. W. Holt, C. E., which were written last week to the Standard in defence of the Navy Island Bridge scheme and with reference to the ferry, expressed the opinion that they were misleading in many particulars.

Must be a Ferry Service.

"Now in the first place, a ferry service must be maintained whether there is a bridge or not, and if the deficiency in the ferry service amounts to \$10,000 now, it would certainly amount to very much more were a bridge constructed."

Improve The West Side.

"A trial last week of running two boats proved most successful, and showed that such a service could be operated on a schedule of nine minutes. It is true that we have had friction in the management of the ferry and that it is not a perfect one."

Successful Trial With Two Boats.
