

THOUSANDS OF SUFFERING IN FLOOD ZONE

People of Stricken Districts Experiencing Untold Hardships—Number of Dead Reaches Fifty.

Bryan, Texas, Dec. 5.—A death roll of more than fifty persons, with scores of flood refugees spending tonight in imminent peril and possibly a 1,000 others marooned and suffering from the prolonged hunger and cold was indicated by tonight's reports from the flooded Brazos river bottom in this section of South Central Texas. For over fifty miles the Brazos were three to five miles wide, and running with mill race speed.

"ONE MAN" STRIKE IN ENGLAND SETTLED

Engineer Who Refused to Haul Tainted Goods Takes Pledge of Good Behavior in the Future.

London, Dec. 5.—The strike on the Great Western Railway which has tied up traffic since Wednesday, was settled today at a conference of the men with the report of the Board of Trade. The 30,000 men of different trades, most of them miners, who had been thrown out of work by the stoppage of traffic, will now return to their labor. Only 1,200 railway men had quit their employment with the locomotive engineer James, who started the strike by refusing to haul "tainted" goods which had been handled by strike breakers in Dublin. He signed a pledge today not to repeat these tactics. This was done at the dictation of the trades union leaders who had not commended the strike.

DECLINE TO TRADE.

Philadelphia, Dec. 5.—Officials of the Philadelphia National League Baseball Club today received a telegram from President Garry Herrmann of the Cincinnati Club, declining their offer to trade Doolan and Knabe for Tinker and Groh. He said, however, that he would see the Philadelphia officials at the National League meeting in New York next week.

SWEDISH STEAMER FOUNDERS: FORTY-SIX LIVES LOST.

Stockholm, Dec. 5.—Forty-six lives were lost today by the foundering of the Swedish steamer Malmberget, off the Norwegian coast. The steamer left Narvik, Norway, November 27, for Rotterdam. The Malmberget was of 3,919 tons.

GRAND TRUNK TAKING OVER CAN.-ATLANTIC

Parliament Asked to Confirm Amalgamation of Lines—Additional Issue of Debentures for Purpose

Ottawa, Dec. 5.—Special.—The Grand Trunk Railway has given notice of a bill providing for the holding of one annual general meeting each year and the submission of accounts to the shareholders, authorizing the payment of interim dividends for the first half of any year without first submitting the balance sheet for the period, and authorizing the issue for the general purposes of the company of additional consolidated debenture stock the annual interest upon which at four per cent. shall not exceed £100,000.

PUBLISHING CIRCULAR ON THE OCEAN RATES

Ottawa, Dec. 5.—The government is publishing a circular among the interests affected by the report of the Chairman Drayton, of the Railway Commission, with regard to the control of ocean freight rates.


