SERVICE DISCONTINUED.

Messrs. William Thomson & Company have received notice that the service of the Canadian line, operating between Montreal, Hamilton, Rotterdam and Bremen, has been discontinued for the present.

FREIGHTS AND CHARTERS.

New York, Aug. 4.—Steamer chartered was entirely suspended and little was doing in sail tonnage. There was a limited inquiry for steamers, with practically no boats offering for any trade. Freight was entirely nominal, with no quotations available.

TO LOAD DEALS.

Spanish steamer Madrideno, Captain Gorin, cleared from New York last Tuesday for Herring Cove to load deals for United Kingdom.

TO MOVE PASSENGERS.

The steamship Mauretania and Cedric, which have 1,400 and 1,000 passengers from Europe, respectively, are reported in our despatches in Halifax harbor. Arrangements are being discussed for transfer of the passengers to New York. The passengers have not yet been landed. It is considered unsafe for the steamers to leave Halifax.

SHIPPING MEN! TAKE NOTICE

NOTICE TO MASTERS AND OWNERS OF SHIPS.

Special Customs Clearance for Ships Leaving Port.

The Minister of Customs hereby gives notice that on and after this date every ship proceeding foreign or coastwise, whether with cargo or in ballast, except as hereinafter exempted, is required to obtain from the collector or other proper officer of customs at the Customs House, a special clearance before leaving the port.

The concessions under which coastwise ships carrying certain goods are exempted from clearance is hereby withdrawn.

Any attempt to leave the port without obtaining such clearance may result in the seizure or destruction of the ship.

The clearance must be preserved for production on demand of any officer of His Majesty's Army, Navy, Militia, Customs, or any constable or police officer, either Federal, Provincial or local in the Dominion of Canada, or any persons employed in such capacity, and is valid only for the voyage specified thereon.
