

Dresden, Ontario, and in 1874 was elected Reeve of Dresden. He removed to British Columbia and settled in New Westminster, and in 1876 was elected Mayor of that City. This position he held till 1878, when he was elected to represent New Westminster district in the House of Commons. He continued as member for that constituency till 1881, when he was appointed to the Senate of which body he is now a member. He is connected with a large number of important enterprises in the district. He is physician and surgeon to the Royal Columbia Hospital, and medical superintendent of the British Columbia Lunatic Asylum. On October 5th, 1865, he married Mrs. Webster, relict of the late George Webster, Esq., of Dresden, Ontario.

McLean, Malcolm Alexander, (Vancouver), born August 14th, 1842, in Argyleshire, Scotland, is the second son of the late Allan McLean, an extensive Argyleshire farmer who came to Canada from Scotland in 1846 and settled in the county of Victoria, Ontario. Here Mr. McLean received his education and subsequently engaged in merchandise, at which he continued in his native county till 1881, when he removed to Winnipeg, at that time experiencing the famous boom. Mr. McLean engaged in business there and invested largely in property in the city of Winnipeg, and also in the agricultural district, and at present owns one of the finest farms in Manitoba. In 1885 he came to Vancouver where he settled and where he has since continued to reside. He was elected first Mayor of Vancouver after the city was incorporated, and was again placed in that position in the following year. While in the occupancy of this office the city made vast strides in growth and improvement, and to his excellent administration of its affairs it is that the city largely owes its present prosperity. For a year Mr. McLean occupied the position of Police Magistrate of the city. He is largely interested in the advancement of the city of Vancouver, where all his interests are centered.

McLeese, Robert, (Soda Creek) descended from a branch of the MacCallum Mores, of Cantire, Scotland, which settled in the county of Antrim, Ireland, in the time of the Young Pretender. Mr. McLeese, the younger of two children of John McLeese and Jennie McArthur McLeese, was born near Coleraine, Antrim, Ireland, June 28, 1828. He was educated at one of the Kildare
