25. To be such Profrssorshipn, Lerturreshipa : nd Trochirship.s ns ning be ectallished by Statute of the University, one ot them to be a Profcusorship of A friculture.
TG. Professors, Lecturern and Teacherstu be appointed by Chancellor un reconmendation of a majority of Members of Board of Contrul.
26. Prufessors on foundation of particular Colleges not to bo deemed by virtue of such Profrssurships, Protcssors within the meaning of 9,11 and iG Sections of this Act.
27. Additional duties may be attached to any Professorship by any Stotute of University without any claim for additional alluwance in respert of such dutice.
28. University to make enccial provision by Statute for di-cipline and Supcrintendence of all persons matriculated in the University, but nut on the Booky of any particular Cullege.
VIII. The estallishment of Independent Colleges and their incorporation with the University.
29. Upon any person conveying an amount of Property to Trustics in -Trust for any College intended to be creeted, sullicient to secure an andual income equivalent to the value of 1000 buslels of wheat, and producing a certiticate irum the Board of Control of their having done so, Crown may by Lettera Patent incorporate such Collerge with the University.
30. Persons thus fuunding Colleres with Profecsorahipe of Divinity, may imposo religious and other Texts in their discration.
