Continued from page 11 Gracious, the STU Executive should give themselves a pat on the back. I wonder if supporting SoundCheck was one of their Campaign promises.


Now, don't get me wrong. I enjoy the CHSR station. I listen to many of its' programs and find it a good change from the "conventional" stations of New Brunswick.




