I have to request you to resurvey the South boundary of the Quesnel Indian reserve No. 1 when you are in that vicinity. I am enclosing for your information a copy of a letter sent this day to Indian Commissioner, Mr. W. E. Ditchburn. Should you require additional information, please communicate direct with him.

You are also requested to re-establish the boundaries of Lot 9032, Cariboo District, which adjoins the Williams Lake Indian reserve No. 3 and was purchased by the Department for the Williams Lake band.

As you will note in the letter to the Indian Commissioner, he has been requested to forward you certain information in connection with this lot. When re-establishing the boundaries of this lot, you are requested either to mark the monuments now in place on the lot with the letters I.R. facing the reserve or if this should conflict with the existing monuments, you should plant Indian reserve posts at several places on the boundary, in order that the Indians and the Indian Agent may be able to determine the limits of the Indian land.
