Uplands, Ontario	1st May 1943		Snow flurries and cloudy to partly cloudy. Redecoration of Officers' Mess ante-room nearing completion. Looks very attractive. Dance held in Sergeants' Mess.	
	2nd May 1943		Overcast. Flying commenced at 0800 hours. Attendance at Church Parade very small owing to flying. Course #77 paraded in Hull, Quebec, in Victory Loan Parade. Uplands Station Band also took part. Flying continued in the afternoon.	
	3rd May 1943		Rain all day. Flying washed out. Softball:- Final League Games - Repair Squadron vs Air Training Wing; Headquarters vs Servicing Squadron.	
	4th May 1943		Cloudy to overcast. Flying throughout the day. W.D. Sports - "Kittyhawks" defeated "Spitfires" at Softball - 20 to 2.	
	5th May 1943		Clear to partly cloudy. Flying continued all day and at night.	
	6th May 1943		Overcast with rain. Quiz Contest on sports and sporting events was held in the Recreation Hall at 2000 hours between Training Wing and Maintenance Squadron. Prizes were awarded to the winners. A musical programme followed with dancing until 2230 hours.	
	7th May 1943		Cloudy to overcast. R161285 LAC Hoyle, F.A. swung Harvard AH198 on landing. Failed to take corrective action in time to prevent aircraft from ground looping. C-2 category. No injury sustained. Main Aerodrome. Dance Club held in the evening in the Recreation Hall and continues with increasing popularity. Regular group of girls from Ottawa "Y" and airwomen were in attendance.
