Sir,

Replying to your letter of the 13th instant I beg to say that the complaint in reference to the quality of school material in connection with which you were written on the 11th instant was made by the teacher of the Tobique Indian school, New Brunswick.

I may add that Miss Bradley is one of the ^{most} competent Indian teachers in the Dominion and the Department is anxious that she should not be hampered in her work by poor material. There may be some Indian schools where proper care would not be taken of the best supplies even if furnished and where the cheaper grades would answer the purpose very well, but this condition does not exist at Tobique.

The number of the requisition referred to is 294, dated 10th of February, 1910.
