Ottawa, 24th December 1919.


Sir,-

A letter was sent you dated the 5th August last enclosing a report made by an engineer of the Department on the road in dispute between Messrs. Jacob and Phillip, the owners of lot 333 and lot 462, which also crosses lot 462, the property of Louis Canadian. You were therein instructed to carry out the suggestion made in that report, which is to the effect that the road should be re-surveyed and built in such a manner as to occupy the least possible area of land.

The Department has been informed that you have taken no action in this matter. Be good enough, at your earliest convenience, to arrange to have all the persons interested meet you on the ground. You should then indicate the route of the road, taking care to lay it out where it will do the least damage. You should warn all parties interested that on no account are they to trespass outside of the route which you have laid out on the ground. It will be advisable for you to get two of the Councillors to accompany you.

It is understood that there would be no objection to the road being constructed on the line indicated in red on the enclosed blue print.
