Such figures as have been given about our man-power resources are tentative estimates which are still under further study, in order that the Government may have the most accurate possible information.

This is the kind of factual information that any country must have in considering the problem of conscription.

Any conscription policy adopted must be based upon actual requirements and a knowledge of the resources available to meet those requirements.

Only with that information can policy be intelligently determined.
