

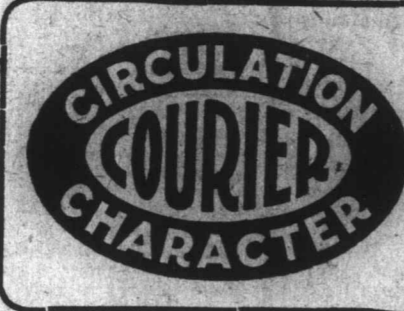

### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family or any male over 21 years of age who is a citizen of the present or was at the date of a subject of an allied or neutral country and cultivation of land in each of three or more homestead sections, or available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the District Office of the Department of the Interior, or by proxy by a person holding a power of attorney. Duties—six months residence upon and cultivation of land in each of three or more homestead sections. In certain districts a homesteader may secure a homestead quarter-section as a pre-condition. Price \$3.00 per acre, plus 10c per acre in each of three years after settling. Homesteads must cultivate 30 acres extra. May obtain pre-emption on certain conditions. A settler after obtaining homestead patent, if he cannot find a homestead, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years. 50 acres and erect a house worth \$100.00. Turnings and special wood work. Holders of entries may count time of cultivation as farm laborers. During 1917, as residence duties under certain conditions. When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served in the war, and have been honorably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entry at local agent's Office (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge papers must be presented to Agent. Deputy Minister of the Interior. N. B.—Unauthorized publication of this advertisement will not be held.
