Germans are Uneasy.

(By the Associated Press)
British Front in France, and Belgium, Aug. 7—The British lines continue to advance on the French City of Lens, north of Arras. Canadian troops, who, on Saturday night, pushed their positions forward approximate, in 200 yards along a front of a thousand yards in the Western environs of the city, late yesterday added a 600 yard front of a similar depth to their defences south and west of the outskirts of that mining centre.

The Germans have been showing signs of decided uneasiness in the Lens sector for several days as has been evidenced by their practice of throwing a curtain of fire on the British trenches each morning at dawn.

Vimy and Farbus towns behind the British lines south of Lens, also bave been shelled alily by the enemy batteries.
The rest of the British front has continued in a state of comparative calm, so far as infantry actions have been concerned.

British Front in France, and Belgium, Aug. 7— The British lines continue to advance on the French City of Lens, north of Arras: Canadian troops, on Saturday night pushed their positions forward approximately 200 yards along a front of a thousand yards in the Western environs of the city, late yesterday by our artillery at an accelerated rate because of the better light, but dull weather has again come and the gunners are disconsolate.

The British war expenditure is rapidly approaching \$40,000,000 per day.
