IN MEXICO Heavy Fighting Still Continues to Take Place--President Has Now Agreed to an Interim President.

(Courier Leased Wire). MEXICO CITY, Feb. 18.—Firing went on practically the whole night from both the federal and rebel positions. In the total darkness, however, it was impossible to ascertain whether any advantage had been gained by either side. Resumed Possession The government troops have again obtained possession of the Young Men's Christian Association building, which had been in the hands of the rebels since the second day's fighting, when they captured it in one of their forward rushes. They caused much trouble to the federalists by mounting machine guns on the roof. Has Agreed. (Courier Leased Wire). MEXICO CITY, Feb. 18.—President Madero has agreed in principle to the appointment of a president ad interim. Disbanded. (Courier Leased Wire). WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—With sickness and famine confronting the people of Mexico in consequence of ten days of street fighting, the white and red cross organizations, have been disbanded, owing to their internal political intrigues. Ambassador Wilson has established an embassy relief organization. Critical. (Courier Leased Wire). MEXICO CITY, Feb. 18.—The situation of the government force became so critical that one strong detachment of federal troops retired from the capital before noon and marched in the direction of Cuernavaca, forty miles to the southward.
