Local and General

The Regina Grain Growers Association meet tomorrow to elect officers and transact other business.

W. Parliament of Grentel has accepted a position with the Bell Telephone Co. of this city.

W. M. Martin took the Gilbert appeal case before the court on banc at Calgary.

The ladies hospital aid are serving lunches at the skating rink during the bonspiel.

There are five rinks here from Sinaluta. This is the largest number from any outside point.

Geo. Hill of Sinaluta is at the 'spiel with the same old rink that has curled here for three years.

Over fifty men of Knox church congregation have formed a mutual benefit society.

The annual meeting of the Regina Victoria hospital will be held in the civic chamber on Feb. 12th.

Nurse McGregor of the Regina, Victoria hospital has gone to her home at Davidson for a visit and brief rest.

The "Rothen murder" is still a mystery. Several arrests have been made, but the murderer is evidently still at large.

Hon. W. B. Motherwell is vice-president of the Abernethy Land and Investment Co. This concern was recently organized.

A report from Prince Albert on Monday stated that the bushmen were running out of supplies and the camps might have to shut down.

Mayor Donnelly of Indian Head; Mayor Bunnell of Moose Jaw; Mayor Hall of Lumsden and Mayor Hamilton of Sinaluta are in the city attending the bonspiel.

Mr. Tyhurst, of South Regina, who was hurt a short time ago while out horse back riding, is at present in the hospital and is in a very critical condition.

The Canadian Northern has issued a new schedule of express rates for the north line. The reductions will show a cut of about fifty cents per one hundred pounds.

A carpenter named Campbell fell from the third story of the Northern bank building and is now lying at the hospital suffering from internal injuries.

The Y.M.C.A. official organ has announced that P. McAra, Jr., McCallum, Hill & Co. and Jas. Ball have each donated \$5000 to the Regina Y.M.C.A.

W. G. V. Bishop and T. H. Robertson of "Forget", are moving to this city to engage in the real estate business. A farewell ball was given them by the citizens of Forget on Tuesday evening.

Mr. and Mrs. Swaisland of Cupar, Sask., arrived in the city on Monday morning to visit at the home of her parents. Mr. Justice and Mrs. Johnston. The Union Bank is building a new residence for Mr. and Mrs. Swaisland at Cupar. They will return home next Monday.

Walter Bunnell a member of the C.P.R. survey party at Weyburn was laid off recently and he attempted suicide by cutting his throat. He was caught in the rash act and sent to the hospital. His father was communicated with at Winnipeg and he came out and took the boy home. The young fellow had been in poor health late.

The decision of the full court at Calgary was against Joseph Gilbert but there is yet hope that the death sentence will at least be commuted to life imprisonment. The department of justice has suspended Mr. Gilbert's execution till Feb. 8th. The minister of justice is being appealed to in the meantime to grant a new trial. Judge Wetmore dissented from his brother judges in the Calgary judgment.
