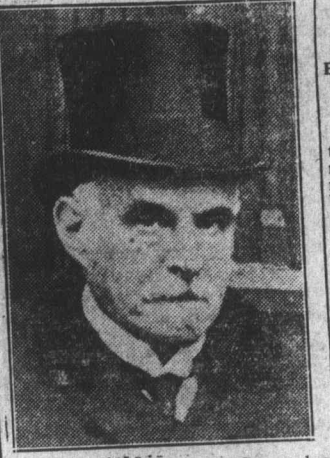

NOVA SCOTIA TO TAX GASOLINE

Bill Introduced in House Provides For Tax Not to Exceed Three Cents a Gallon

By provisions of a Bill introduced in the House of Assembly last Friday afternoon by Hon. William Chisholm, a tax, not to exceed three cents a gallon, is to be placed on gasoline sold in the Province, but it does not apply to farmers, fishermen and others using gasoline for any other purpose than in motor cars.

The main provisions of the Bill are: No person shall sell gasoline in the Province of Nova Scotia unless and until such a person holds a license therefor, and unless such license is in force.
