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Carleton County is Denied Bye-Election and House Goes Into Supply on 19 to 15 Vote

Mr. Mesereau of Sunbury Says His Opinions Have Not Changed but He Voted the Other Way—Supporters Criticize Government Lack of Assistance to Immigration and Failure to Provide Adequate Salaries for the School Inspectors—Mr. Young Secures Promise of Highway to Napudogan.

By a vote of 19 to 15, one-quarter of the members being absent or paired, the Legislature yesterday afternoon voted down the amendment not to go into Supply until writs had been issued to fill the vacancy existing in Carleton county's representation and then passed the Supply motion by the same vote.

This action followed the longest Budget debate in recent history at least, having lasted for three weeks and two days, and with the House sitting throughout the weekend passing Supply the opinion has been expressed that prorogation will be reached by the end of next week. However, it is believed a more correct view is that the House will have all it can do to finish its business properly by the latter part of the following week.

The voting down of the amendment to the Supply motion was preceded by two amusing incidents in which former Premier Robinson and Mr. Mesereau of Sunbury participated. Hon. Mr. Robinson, who had moved adjournment of the debate for the second time, did not advance any argument why the Carleton county vacancy should have been filled long ago, and Mr. Mesereau merely told the House that he had not changed his previous opinion—which he has expressed when he condemned the failure of the Government to fill the vacancy in Carleton county as "bad policy and bad politics"—but that he was going to vote against his own opinion as thus explained, which he did.

Mr. Robinson, on the order of the day being called, said that it was not his intention to prolong the Budget debate or to speak at length on the amendment moved by the acting leader of the Opposition. He wished to point out that, in view of the fact that it was the constitutional right of every constituency to have its full representation, Moncton was entitled to two members, whereas it had only one. The two hon. members who represented Carleton county gave that proportion of the population a larger representation than the city of Moncton had at the present time, and while he sympathized with the idea that Moncton was entitled to its full quota, he would not go to the extent of holding up Supply in order that it might be accomplished.

Mr. Mesereau said he had previously made a statement in regard to the vacancy in Carleton. He had expressed only his own opinion and he had not changed it. He believed, however, that the Government would in the near future do the right thing by the county of Carleton, and not wishing to have Supply further delayed, he would vote against the amendment.

On the amendment being put by Mr. Speaker, the House divided as follows:

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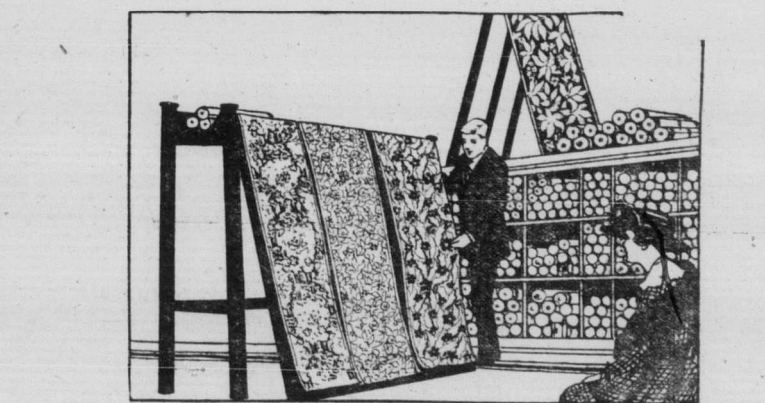
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
