Dion Boucicault's Film Story at the Nickel Theatre to-day.

Scalded to Death

FATAL ACCIDENT AT BELL ISLAND.

Little Kathleen Billingsby, the two-year-old daughter of Mr. Wm. Billingsby, of the Wabana Boot & Shoe Co., died at Bell Island, on Saturday night, from injuries received in a scalding accident. The little one was playing in the kitchen near a large pan of boiling water—intended for her bath—and during the temporary absence of the servant from the room, the child fell into the water. Her screams brought her parents to the scene, but although medical help was immediately procured, nothing could be done, as the little sufferer only died an hour. Much sympathy is expressed with Mr. and Mrs. Billingsby over the sad affair.

Herring Fishery.

So far this season a larger number of vessels with herring cargoes left the West Coast for American and Canadian ports than for any previous year and it is the opinion of those engaged that this year's fishery will be unprecedentedly successful. Advice was received in the city yesterday to the effect that herring are in abundance at Bonne Bay and Bay of Islands. The Arms at the latter place are teeming with the fish at present and good work is being done there by herring catchers. There are now about a dozen vessels all along the west coast awaiting for cargoes.
