Will Aid Entente!

The German declaration of war against Portugal will do Portugal little or no harm and will be of some help to the Entente Allies. Portugal is separated from Germany, Austria and Turkey by France, Switzerland, Italy and Spain and there is therefore complete immunity from attacks over-land. Overseas attacks on the coast of Portugal is out of the question so long as Britain and her allies hold supremacy at sea. Portuguese East Africa marches on German East Africa, the latter being to the north of the former, with the River Ruvuma separating the two colonies. As the Germans in their sole remaining colonies have their hands full in defending themselves, it is unlikely that they can do much damage to the Portuguese colony. The state of war between Germany and Portugal will be distinctly helpful to the allies. Before the war it was impossible to prevent supplies reaching the German colony through the Portuguese colony. German East Africa is now, however, completely surrounded by enemies. On the north it is hemmed in by British East Africa, where it is reported to-day that General Smuts has relieved some German crossings in the Kilima Njaro district. On the west the frontier is closed by the Belgian Congo, the better part of which, Lake Tanganyika runs along, and the German coast of it is at the mercy of British submarines. To the south it is hemmed in by Rhodesia and Portuguese East Africa. The east border of the German frontier is sea coast, which is blockaded by a British fleet. German East Africa is thus completely isolated, and is now liable to attacks not only from the British and Belgians, but from the Portuguese. This new war should be a material aid to the British and should be particularly valuable in aiding in the subjugation of the last remaining overseas colony of the British Empire. In addition, the German steamers seized will be of use in relieving the tonnage difficulty of Portugal, and will thus be of benefit to the allies generally.

S. S. Bonaventure Not Reported.

The S.S. Bonaventure, Capt. Randall, has not been reported since she left Glasgow a month ago for Alexandria, en route to Archangel, Russia. She is supposed to be jammed in the exceedingly heavy ice encountered, like the Adventure, which is a long while on the passage from Alexandria to Archangel, without being reported, owing to the heavy ice pack. However, no anxiety need be felt for these on board either ship.

FIRE AT DRY DOCK.—At 11.50 this morning a slight fire broke out in an old shed used as a casting house, situated on the west with frontage on the street leading to the Long Bridge. The fire is supposed to have been caused by flying sparks from a shunting engine or nearby chimney. Both west and central brigades responded, but the fire was extinguished with the use of buckets.

SITUATION UNCHANGED.
PARIS, To-day.
There was no change in the situation before Verdun, either east or west of the Meuse, according to a semi-official announcement made here this afternoon.

AIR SERVICE CANDIDATE ELECTED.

LONDON, To-day.
After having been defeated in a recent widely advertised bye-election in Milneville district for a seat in the Commons, Pemberton Billing, who resigned from the Royal Naval Air Service to stand for Parliament on the issue of better protection against Zeppelins has been elected member for East Hertfordshire by a majority of 1021 over the coalition candidate, Brodie Henderson. Billing made a denunciation of Great Britain's alleged inefficiency in air service, the basis of both his campaigns.

FORTY-FIVE NAVAL CASUALTIES

LONDON, To-day.
British torpedo boat destroyer Conquest and torpedo boat No. 11 have been sunk by striking mines was officially announced this afternoon. The announcement says the number of casualties in connection with the sinking of the warships was 45.

FRENCH CHEERED BY GOOD NEWS

LONDON, To-day.
The situation at Verdun is regarded as much better from the French viewpoint as a result of yesterday's fighting. The public is greatly cheered by reports of success of the resistance on the part of the defenders of the fortress. Notwithstanding the enormous expenditure of ammunition and the untold sacrifice of life, the Germans have failed to bend, much less break, the blue line. The inference drawn by the general public is that the German wave has advanced as far as it is in its power without further wastage on a large scale, which the German General Staff hesitates to make with four army corps already put out of action in a struggle of 13 days.

EXPOSED GERMAN FALSE WAR NEWS.

PARIS, To-day.
An official note has been issued categorically denying the statement made in the German official communication of March 9th that "The village and armoured forts of Vaux were captured in a glorious night attack by the Posen reserve regiments under the leadership of General Von Curetsky Corritz." This assertion, the note says, is in every way false. The note also denies other statements contained in recent German official communications. The announcement adds that the violent bombardment continues on both banks of the Meuse but that there has been no infantry attack by the Germans.

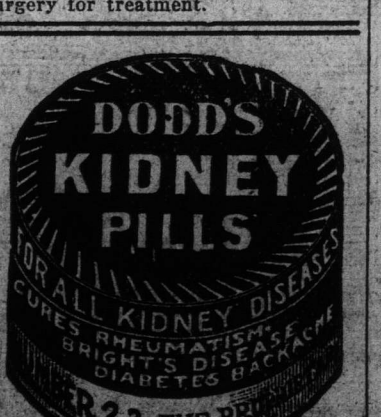

How the Tidings Came.

The first strong grip on my heart of that great happening was when I saw a solitary horseman in full war array riding by the shore. He had come from a rule hamlet near Cape Wrath, and was going to join his brethren in this conflict of races. That lonely horseman was a symbol, not only of the unity which in our hearts becomes ever deeper and more assured, but of the rich stream of life flowing from every strath and hamlet, from every colony and island, where our Scottish kinsmen have found a home."

Germans Nabbed in New York Had U. S. Fort Plans.

New York, March 1.—Suddenly breaking into the quarters of Richard von Ahrend and Rudolph von Kracht, said to be German naval lieutenants, to arrest them on a postal conspiracy charge, Post Office inspectors to-day confiscated a batch of American plans found in the men's effects.

The men were taken to the Federal building to be arraigned on a charge of using the mails to further a fraudulent conspiracy. The discovery, officials said, was unexpected and reveals a new angle to the alleged alien plot investigations.

The two men will be arraigned late to-day before the United States Commissioner, Mr. Houghton. The United States District Attorney, Mr. Marshall, will demand they be held in heavy bond. Postal authorities said the men proved on charitable persons by pretending to collect funds for suffering Belgians.
