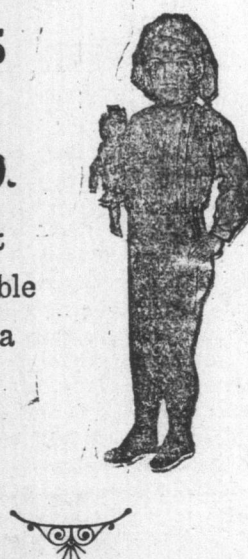

## Nfld. Scotch Cured Herring.

During the early part of November  
stocks of Newfoundland Scotch cured  
herring were moving freely, due to  
anxiety on the part of dealers to "get  
out from under" before the arrival of  
new goods on the market. One large  
dealer, who had on hand more than  
10,000 packages, sold what he could  
for as low as \$11 in order to get them  
off his hands. A part of these goods  
were said to be below quality, how-  
ever. The reason advanced by several  
New York factors for the inferior  
goods this year is that they were al-  
lowed to remain on the wharves at  
Newfoundland during the heat of the  
summer before being shipped. It is  
believed that Newfoundland packers  
will experience considerable difficulty  
in finding buyers of the new pack at  
present asking prices, as there is a  
large supply of excellent quality

Scotch herring available, as well as  
huge stores of old pack Newfound-  
land. Therefore, it will be no easy  
matter to dispose of anything but the  
finest Newfoundland goods. Only  
small quantities of the new pack have  
come into the New York market so  
far, and the quality of these goods is  
reported very poor. Most of the  
dealers, however, are waiting patiently  
for the Green Bay goods, which ought  
to be along about the last of Decem-  
ber or the beginning of January.—Dec.  
Fishing Gazette.
