any regular diplomatic representative in that quarter and may not deem it advisable to send one thither for the special purpose mentioned by her Britannic Majesty's Government. No objection, how-ever, was entertained to directing, as would be done by the Consul of the United States at Zanzibar, to intimate to the sovereign of that country that we would be glad to see that provision of the Barley, perh treaty between him and Great Britain terminated, which reserved the right of transportation by sea between certain limits of his own territory of domestic slaves, as there was reason to believe that right, reserved under that treaty, was the principal cause of the evil complained of, and that it also had been abused. Minister Thornton thanked our Government for having acceeded to the wishes

of Her Majesty.
Secretary Robinson, in pursuance of the suggestion of Secretary Fish gave instructions to the first vessel of the U.S. Navy proceeding to, or returning from Asiatic stations, to touch at Zanzibar or Muscat, and inform the Sultan or Imaum or his authority, that the U. S. Government looks with solicitude to abrogation clause of the treaty referred to, and to express the hope that his enlightened Government would consider seriously the propriety and advantage of doing so or, if the clause should be abrogated be e such visit to express satisfaction, the fore such visit to express satisfaction, one U.S. Government has pléasure in congratulating Inaum on his humane and statesmanlike conduct in suppressing what has been converted, or is supposed to have been, converted into abuse.

last accordingly sent to Commander Byron Wilson, commanding the Yuntic to co-operate with Sir H. Befria, agent of Her Britannic Majesty's Government, in any proper way to secure success of his mission to Museat.

Washington, Jan. 10.—Secretary Fish has instructed Minister Sickles to remonstrate with Spain against the apparent failure of that Government to carry out the emancipation Act in Spanish and American colonies; also that the cause of many lawless expeditions from the United States to Cuba encourages slavery, against which such expeditions are ostensibly simed, has not after four year's struggle been removed, nor the insurrection stopped. Some action to that end should be adopted by Spain, as the ceaseless watchfulness on the part of our Gov-ernment has been carried to the verge of exhausted patience. This country looks Spain to remove the causes of complaint, in order that unfriendly feelings between the two Governments may be re-
