

Young Australian Is Sensation of Olympic Swimming Events Yesterday

ANDY CHARLTON PUTS HIS COUNTRY IN SWIM

Antipodean Team Leads U. S. Crack by One Point.

"CAN SWIM FASTER"

Paris, July 15.—Upon completion of two days of the Olympic swimming program this evening, Australia stood first in the list of 23 nations entered, with 24 points. The United States was second with one point behind.

The feature of the day's program came when Andrew Charlton, the Australian swimmer, created several world records in winning the 1,500 metre swim, free style.

Johnny Weismuller of the United States is looked upon as the only entrant with a possible chance of defeating the great old Australian. Charlton, who seven weeks ago was picking cabbages and milking cows in far away Australia, said tonight:

"I can swim much faster than I have done so far."

He did not appear to extend himself in scoring heavily today over his Scandinavian rival, Arne Borg, of Sweden.

His time, 20 minutes, 6.3-5 seconds, set a new world's record.

GOOD TEE SHOTS AND BRASSIE SHOTS

ADDRESS BALL BEHIND WITH CLUB HEAD RESTING NATURALLY NOT FLUTED

KEEP STIFF LEFT ARM AT BEGINNING OF UP-SWING TO GET CLUB WELL BEHIND BALL

RIGHT OF BODY SHOULD BE ON RIGHT LEG AT TOP OF BACKSWING

AND SHOULD BE TRANSFERRED ORNAMENTALLY TO LEFT ON DOWNSWING.

AT TOP OF SWING BE SURE THAT LEFT WRIST FALLS UNDER CLUB SHAFT.

What are some of the important points in getting good tee shots and good brassie shots?

Answered by DAVID BROWN, veteran tournament player, former British open champion. Noted especially for his short game and accuracy on approach.

1. Address the ball behind with the club head resting naturally on the ground and not tilted in any way.

2. Have a stiff left arm at the beginning of the upward swing so as to get the club well behind the ball.

3. At the top of the swing be sure that the left wrist falls under the club shaft. At this point the weight of the body should also be resting on the right leg.

4. Transfer the weight gradually from the right leg to the left in making the downswing.

CANADA SHOOT 2ND IN GRAPHIC

South African Team Lead—Calgary Man High in City of London.

Bisley Camp, July 15.—Sergeant Major W. A. Hawkins, Toronto, was second in the Daily Graphic Cup squared competition yesterday, open to all comers, 200 and 300 yards, seven shots per man at each distance.

W. T. Phillips, late of the 5th Devonshire, scored 33 out of a possible 40, valued at 25.10, with scores of 34 and 35, total 69 out of a possible 70.

Rochelle Maid, 2:05 1/4, a member of W. H. R. Fleming's string, has been shipped to North Randall track, Cleveland, O., to Fred Egan, who will race the daughter of Atlantic Express in the 2:05 1/4 class.
