INFANTICIDE CASE DISCOVERED HERE

Mother Allowed New Born Child to Die From Neglect.

INQUEST HELD

Tuesday evening, Dr. Martin was called to attend a domestic at the home of a well known citizen. During his investigation he found the body of an infant in the room occupied by the girl.

The circumstances were such that Dr. Martin, who is a coroner for this district, held an inquest at the Police Court yesterday afternoon. The following jury were sworn to hear the evidence and to find a verdict. M. M. Mowat, foreman; J. F. Andrew, Geo. Vermette, Joseph Boudreau, S. W. Dimock, Elias Lutes and Jean Boudreau.

The evidence of Dr. Pinault, who made a post mortem examination of the body, the undertaker and two other witnesses was heard, after which the jury retired and later brought in a verdict that the child had come to its death through the criminal neglect of the mother.
