The Report of the Committee Unfavorable to Female Law Students. Æmilius Irving, Q.C., presided at the half-early meeting of the Law Society. The yearly meeting of the Law Society. The regular meeting of the Astronomical and Physical Society was held at the office of Dr. G. B. Foster, Yonge and Gerrard-of Dr. G. B. Foster, Yonge and Gerrard-having reliable brands. With the Astronomers. of Dr. G. B. Foster, Yonge and Gerrardstreets. Several gentlemen were proposed for membership. It was decided to form a section of the society for practical telescopic work to meet on alternate Mondays. Garrett P. Serviss' work on "Astronomy with an Opera Glass" will be used as a text book to aid the section in its studies. Reports of observations were received from several of the members. This being a period of great solar activity there has been much interest taken in te'escopic and spectroscopic work upon the sun. A number reported having observed the penumbræ of sun spots in a ncuachromatic telescope of small aperture. Mr. Miller reported having observed an interesting prominence which he calculated to be about \$3,000 miles in height and from a careful study of its spectrum arrived at the conclusion that the whole column was in rapid rotation. He also noted that the umbræ of the spots, which appeared black, needed a low magnifying power, had the appearance of a blue haze interspersed with white granules when a high power and full aperture of the evening was read by Dr. Foster on "Static Electricity." The application to the science of medicine was explained and the various apparatus and appliances exhibited. The large static machine was of particular interest. This registers \$50,000 volts under favorable circumstances.


