An important step is being taken in the direction of bringing into affiliation under one catalogue system several of

the public and technical libraries of Montreal. The preparation of the catalogue is in the hands of Mr. Gould, librarian of McGill University. The card system will be employed. The management of the new public library at Westmount, a suburb of Montreal, wisely entrusted to Mr. Gould the selection and cataloguing of their books. Thereby the duplicating of books which are already included in McGill and other public libraries of the city has been avoided. The proposal has been made, and will doubtless be approved, that the Art Association, the Canadian Society of Civil Engineers, the Fraser Institute, the Province of Quebec Association of Architects, and perhaps other public bodies possessing libraries should arrange to have their collections catalogued by Mr. Gould in the manner described.
