Hollinger Reducing Costs.

Several improvements that are expected to decrease the cost of mining and milling are being installed at the Hollinger. At present eighty stamps are running at the Hollinger mill. Twenty of these are on ore from the Asme Gold Mines. Limited. An additional twenty stamps are being erected to treat Acme ore, and these will be dropping within a few days. The capacity of the sixty stamps on Hollinger ore is in the neighborhood of eight hundred tons a day. Two units of the new cyanide plant have been completed and the third will handle the slime from the additional twenty Aome stamps.

Altho development work on the Hollinger is about thirty feet below the 800 foot level, the attention of the management is being paid to sinking a det rial shaft on Acme property to the sixty stamps and the siming men are of the opinion that the imperial property will add to the Porcupine gold production before a certal shaft on Acme property to the fitteen drills will be operated.
