and carried to any other part of the Upper-town, within the gates, there shall be paid nine pence, and for every puncheon of melasses, taken and carried within the said limits one shilling and one penny.

XIX. That from and after the publication hereof no person or persons keeping caleshes, carriages, or other carriages for hire, within the town or suburbs of Quebec, shall ask or receive more than seven shillings and six pence currency, for carrying one or two persons with their baggage to the Post-house at Lorrette, or for the use of their calesh or carriage with a horse and man to drive the same for the space of one day, to go to any place not exceeding four leagues from Quebec, the sum of ten shillings and no more; and it is ordered that all and every person whatsoever shall have one or more horse-bells affixed to the collar of each horse, which he or she shall cause to be tackled to any train, sled or carriage which he or she shall drive or cause to be driven in the city or environs of Quebec, so long as the snow shall remain on the ground. And all carters and every other person letting horses and carriages to persons, riding Post, shall carry their fare to the first stage at Lorrette under the penalty of twenty shillings.

And to prevent frauds by the drivers of carts, trucks or other carriages, who work for hire, It is hereby ordered, that no person or persons keeping caleshes, carriages or other carriages for hire within the town or suburbs of Quebec, shall presume to exercise the profession of a carter, or let or hire his or their calesh or caleshes, carriage or carriages, after the publication hereof, without obtaining a certificate from the Clerk of the Peace, specifying the number of his cart or carriage and the time of his being registered as such;
