PEACE TREATY IN SHAPE BY MARCH TWENTY-SECOND

Paris, March 2.—President Wilson on his return to France will land at Brest on March 13 or 14, and come direct to Paris. The British prime minister will reach Paris about the same time, and with the others of the council of the great powers they will take up the preliminary peace treaty, which will then be ready. It is said that these discussions will last until March 22, when Mr. Lloyd George will return to England and President Wilson will go to Brussels and the devastated regions.

NEGOTIATIONS ARE BROKEN OFF BETWEEN POLES AND UKRAINIANS

Warsaw, March 2.—Negotiations at Lemberg between the inter-allied mission and the Poles and Ukrainians have been broken off, it being impossible to get the Ukrainians and Poles to agree on a line of demarcation between their forces. Hostilities are about to be resumed, it is reported. The inter-allied mission is expected here tomorrow.

NAVIGATION ON DANUBE

Paris, March 2.—A Havas despatch from Prague says that a provisional agreement has been reached between the Czechs and Jugoslavs with respect to navigation on the Danube. The Czech-Slavic republic obtains what is described as "almost sovereign rights."

Marshal Foch Presents Terms to Supreme Council -- Germany Restricted to Army of 200,000 Men -- Severe Restrictions on Manufacture of Munitions.

Paris, March 2.—Marshal Foch presented yesterday to the council of the great powers the military terms to be incorporated in the peace treaty. These will be considered on Monday with the naval terms already submitted to the council.

Disarming Fortifications

The provision for the dismantling of the fortifications of Holigoland and Kiel Canal has been made the subject of reservation by Admiral Beagan, representing the United States, whereby this shall not be a precedent applicable to American canal and harbor defenses such as Hell's Gate, Cape Cod Canal and others.

Disarming Fortifications

The proposal for the destruction of the large German warships is approved in the report by the British and American naval authorities, but the French still make reservations against the destruction of these ships. The supreme council is expected to pass on this and other naval and military subjects on Monday.
