All grain rates from Prescott, etc., water, to points in Ontario, have been cancelled as from Prescott to Kingston, Toronto and Hamilton, and 5 cents; on the Midland division to Chateaufort and south, and 10 cents on the Midland division to points north and west of Peterboro', 6-1/2 cents.
