## UNCLE SAM EXPECTED IT.

Nicaragua's seizure did not astonish the officials at Washington.

Washington, Aug. 1.—The seizure of the property of the Maritime Canal Company by the Nicaraguan Government has been expected, according to the United States Government has done all that it could to conserve the rights of the concessionaires. Under the terms of the concession the Nicaragua Canal Company was allowed a period of ten years after the completion of preliminary surveys in which to complete construction of the canal. That period expired nearly two years ago. The company, which had done a great deal of work, was expected to reorganize the management of the transfer of its properties and privileges to the Government of the United States through some of the various Nicaraguan officials that have been introduced in Congress, and more or less advanced to enactment within recent years.
