Ottawa, Dec. 5 .- Although the ques tion of the development of trade within the empire was touched upon by several members of the House of Commons in the course of the debate on the introwhich may have far-reaching results escaped with scant attention. The matter to which it is desired to draw notice is the possibiliy of the immediate diversion of an important portion of the British West Indian fruit trade from imports of oranges and limes during the period covered by the trade returns for the fiscal year that concluded or June 30 last were valued at \$1,635,249 of which the British West Indian contribution amounted to \$54,816, duty t the extent of \$187,807 being paid or the whole. By the placing of thes items on the free list a loss of revenue to the extent of \$190,000 has been estimated by the Minister of Finance, bu under the circumstances it may b reasonably concluded that there will be an increase in the volume of trade which will justify the action taken.


