1,531 points run—M. Vignaux, 3-ball caroms, 4000-point game (800 points per night), against G F Slosson, who ran 1,103—Cremorne Hall, Paris, France, April 10-14, '80..... Highest in America, 804, by Ed McLaughlin, match of 1000 points—Philadelphia, December 12, '83.

1,483 points run—John MoDevitt, 4-ball game, 1,500 points up, match—N Y City, Jan 8, '68.

398 points run—George Slosson, Champion's Game, three-ball caroms, 3,000 points (600 per night)—Grand Hotel, Paris, France, Jan. 30-Feb. 3, '82..... Second highest, 394, by M Vignaux, same game as above.

351 points run—Champion's Game, J R Heiser, match of 600 points, N Y City, Feb 14, '84. Highest in America at this game, line 14x28, the same as between Slosson and Vignaux in Paris.

246 points run—M Vignaux against Lon Morris, Chicago tournament, April, '83. This is highest run on record at eight-inch balkline game in America.

77 points run—Wm Sexton, cushion caroms, 600 points — Tammany Hall, N Y City, Dec 29, '81.
