notwithstanding such objection, the said district should be set off, the Bishop may thereupon set off the same as if such objection had not been made. And a memorial of the setting off such proposed parish and of the bounds and limits thereof, under the hand and seal of the Bishop of the Diocese, shall be registered at full length in the office of the Registrar of Deeds for the County wherein the same is situate, who is hereby required to receive and register the same with the records and Deeds of the said County, on payment of the like fees as he is entitled to receive for the registry of Deeds; and from and after the registry of such memorial the said districts shall be and continue as a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the terms of this Act; and such memorial shall at all times be evidence that all the acts required by this section have been duly performed.

A meeting of the persons entitled in each parish to vote in the election of Church Wardens and Vestrymen shall be held on Easter Monday in each year.

That the words "Easter Monday" be struck out, and the words "during Easter week" be inserted instead.

"Notice given in each Church or Chapel of Ease within the parish, where Service shall be held on the Sunday before the day of such meeting, shall be sufficient."
