- 1. Because the Murray government is the Flemming government under another name. at Gibson on Wednesday last that Flemming's critics were not fit to "unlatch his shoes." - 5. Martin J. Robichaud was condemned by Commissioner Chandler for manipulation of highway acounts in Gloucester county. He is one of Murray's purity candidates today.
- 6. When Premier Clark announced that the government was considering the question of the license law or prohibition, men close to the government gathered in \$6,000 from the liquor dealers. For what? You do not need to be told.

- 7. Hon. John Morrissy, a member of the Flemming and Clarke governments, charged Hon. B. Frank Smith declared that answers made up by officers of his department were changed and falsified by his colleagues before being presentof traitors."
