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HIGHER RANGE OF PRICES ON STOCK MARKET

Waning Influence of British Strike On New York Exchange Noticed

SEVERE BREAKS OCCUR ON FOREIGN EXCHANGE

Trading In Montreal Dull This Morning With Do-Households

NEW YORK, May 5.—The waning influence of the British labor crisis on the local securities markets was attested by the higher range of stock prices at the day's opening. Renewed accumulation for long account was encouraged by the market's good resistance to bearish changes. Speculators and New York Central and Canadian Pacific advanced a point. The rise took place in the face of several breaks in the foreign exchanges, which carried French and Belgian francs to new low records.

MONTREAL, May 5.—Trading on the local stock exchange during the first half hour this morning was a rather dull affair, with trading mostly confined to Canadian issues. This issue was fairly heavily liquidated, but met with good support, closing at 84 1/2 for a gain of a half and subsequently sold at 85 1/2. The rest of the list was steady and few changes occurred. Steelers and New Asbestos were particularly inactive, the former losing one-eighth at 18 1/2, while New Asbestos was unchanged at 22. Dominion Bridge was the strong spot, up two points at 96. Steamships gained a half at 48. Montreal Power was up a half at 22, and Brompton up a quarter at 20 1/2.
