The quantity of sugar and molasses exported from the West Indies last year fell below the estimate by nearly 24,000 tons. Slight increases over their estimates were made in Jamaica, Barbados, St. Kitts and St. Vincent, but a shortage of 30,000 tons occurring in Trinidad and British Guiana left the net total shortage as stated above. In British Guiana left the net total shortage as stated above. In British Guiana the shortage was accounted for by the scarcity of labor in the colony, but in Trinidad there was no apparent good reason why there should have been a shortage. To quote the Trinidad Monthly Produce Report and Statistics, "There was every inducement in the matter of remunerative prices to stimulate production. Favorable weather seemed to further justify the hope of a bumper, if not a record crop, yet the ultimate result was most unsatisfactory, and the most reasonable explanation, perhaps, might be found in the difficulty experienced in obtaining sufficient artificial manures."

PUBLIC NOTICE. Under Sub-Section 2 of Section 78 of the Highway Act of 1918 no motor the Highway Act of 1918 no motor vehicle is allowed on any highway of the Province in the Spring of the year while the frost is coming out of the ground, without permission of the Supervisor, with the exception of physicians, clergymen and ambulance drivers. Sub-section 1 of the same section of the Act forbids the carrying of loads over 3,000 pounds and the hauling of portable mills on wheels between the fifteenth day of March and the fifteenth day of May, in any year, without a written permit from the Supervisor of Roads. This notice will remain in force until the supervisor is satisfied that the road is fit for motor traffic, as applied to sub-section 2, and until arrangements be made with the

Supervisor in compliance with the Act, as applied to sub-section 1.
