Milwaukee, Dec. 25.—After many sleepless nights and considerable expense, Promoter Jim Coffroth, of San Francisco, has succeeded in re-matching Willie Ritchie and "Harlem" Tommy Murphy for Jan. 23, the bout for Dec. 10 having been called off because of a slight operation on Willie's nose. The weight will be the same—135 pounds one hour before weighing time—which is 135 pounds inside. Perhaps Ritchie intends to try to raise the limit to 135 pounds, which would harmonize with the weight for that class in all parts of the world where boxing holds forth, except that in most countries the weighing-in time is at two or three o'clock in the afternoon of the day of the battle.
