The firm of art dealers which was victimized was that of Mr. J. Rochelle Thomas, of the Georgian Gallery, King-street, St. Jumes', whose two sons were received by "Bolton" in Gordon-Woodhouse's residence in Park-place.


The U. P. dissolution seems to be settled and set for February 24 for official ratification by the courts.


THE LAST BLOCKHOUSE.
