A committee was appointed to obtain all needful information on the propriety of relinquishing the Magazine and adopting the Paper. All persons interested in the subject are requested to express their sentiments to that committee. It is hoped the Paper will very shortly go into operation.

The most perfect harmony pervaded the Association throughout the deliberations. The resolutions and measures adopted by the body all appear judicious, and when carried into effect must be highly beneficial to the interests of the people of this Province.
