Hoey transferred this interest to the Adams Express Company for \$350,000, causing the money to be paid to himself and others, out of the funds of the company, while he was holding the same in a judiciary capacity. By so doing, the bill continued, he appropriated \$276,905 to his own use and that of others, in fraud of the rights of the Adams Express Company.

Prior to March 12, 1888, Hoey, either individually or in connection with other persons, acquired the remaining interest of the New York & Boston Dispatch Company and the kindred corporations named above, paying therefore \$80,000. This interest he transferred to the Adams Express Company for \$500,-


